

## What are Arts Powered Results according to New York state law?

If New York City continues to build on the work begun by The Center for Arts Education and its collaborators—and become an Arts Powered System—then every public school could offer as a baseline the arts education guaranteed by New York state law:

- ✓ Primary students would spend at least 20 percent of their time learning in, through, and about the arts
- ✓ Middle and high school students would each take at least one arts course
- ✓ Elementary students would spend at least 10 percent of their time learning in, through, and about the arts
- ✓ Qualified teachers in visual art, music, theater, and dance would be in classes throughout the city
- ✓ Arts-focused middle and high schools would have enough seats to permit all interested and committed youth to attend
- ✓ More businesses and arts organizations would offer internships and summer jobs that open careers in the arts to interested young people
- ✓ Cultural organizations would build programs that support student and family learning in the arts during out-of-school time as well as during the school day

In addition, students and families throughout the city would have the information to:

- ✓ Advocate for arts learning
- ✓ Visit schools where strong arts learning happens
- ✓ Learn about and participate in programs that extend students' arts learning both during and outside of school
